Collections suffered because of low attendance to Masses, hence the PAC continued to limit our budget for 2021.

Highlights:

- 1. The grant we sent to the De La Salle College of St Benilde, was part of a fund that helped send 149 Deaf Scholars to school for a year of which 28 Deaf graduated from university!
- 2. The 50% lower support for the SALIS school meant we could only support 3 poor but deserving high school students.
- 3. We are supporting 4 girls, 1 of whom graduated at the top of her class in primary level in the St Kizito Parish School, Kenya. 2 of them have moved up to Grade 8 last March, the other 2 will move up this December.
- 4. Of the 11 we originally supported in the Comboni School, Kenya, 9 students are now in Form 4 class. Most come from the slums in the Eastlands of Nairobi. Their annual tuition, transport, uniforms and textbooks are provided. We "lost" 2 students as their families had to move from the city to the villages because they could no longer sustain themselves due to employment difficulties brought on by COVID.
- 5. New project in Lebanon, Institute de Reeducation Audio Phone (IRAP) for deaf students was introduced by Giovanna Craig.

We continue to look for education-related charity projects in Latin America and the Middle East that we can support. The current members of the Global Outreach team are "retiring" and so we are looking for a fresh batch of volunteers who can help us manage the Charity funds of the Parish.
